Jeannette Rockefeller was the founding president of AAP – Food Samaritans. Established in 1997 to honor the humanitarian efforts of outstanding community members such as Jeannette, this award recognizes individuals who have contributed their energy, commitment, and influence to raise awareness and funding for important issues including HIV/AIDS.

The same year this award was created, the Auen Foundation relocated to the Coachella Valley and chose to support AAP for the first time, and the foundation has done so ever since.

Sherrie Auen, Ron Auen, and Catharine Reed – three of the most caring people in the world – have a gift for knowing how to make significant impacts. Since first establishing the Auen Foundation in 1991, the private family foundation has redefined its mission as times and needs have evolved. The Auen Foundation primarily focuses on assisting the aging population, which its trustees believe is an important component of a vibrant community. The Auen Foundation is dedicated to supporting programs that benefit mature adults and connect generations. To date, the Auen Foundation has awarded more than 1000 grants to charitable and educational programs and services, primarily in the Coachella Valley.

The Herb Lazenby Community Service Award was created to recognize an individual's outstanding commitment to service within their community. The award carries the name of its inaugural recipient, Dr. Herb Lazenby, whose name became synonymous with Community Service here in the Coachella Valley.

We have been honored that the Desert Tennis Association, represented by Nabil Najjar, has supported AAP - Food Samaritans with their annual event for many years. Before moving to Rancho Mirage Nabil had been a Los Angeles resident and a long-time tennis coach for the Los Angeles Tennis Association. For more than 15 years he has been the Tournament Director of the Palm Springs Open which takes place over the Thanksgiving weekend, and he developed, organized and served as Tournament Director of the Palm Springs Doubles and the GLTA Grass Court Championships held at Mission Hills Country Club in Rancho Mirage.

He became tournament director for the Palm Springs Open in 2001 and AAP has been the designated beneficiary of this tournament since 2005. We are extremely grateful for the ongoing support. Without volunteers, no non-profit organization could survive, let alone thrive. AAP – Food Samaritans relies on the dedication and commitment of an amazing group of volunteers. This award is named after Frank Jurczyk, who was a volunteer and cornerstone of our Volunteer program for many years. Frank was the organization's right arm in the late '90s when we operated with a staff of one. In honor of him, AAP frequently honors a single volunteer or pair of volunteers who stand out. Previous recipients of the award include Michael Leppen, Dana Adkins, and Bob Crebo. The 2018 award is going to two such volunteers.

Denise Haslam was born in Petersburg, Alaska and grew up in Riverside, California. She received a Master's degree from the University of Redlands in Communicative Disorders and has been working as a Speech Pathologist with school-aged children and adult stroke recovery patients since 1986.

She says that volunteering came naturally to her because she watched her mother give of her time to help organize community events and fund raisers even though she was a single mother of three and worked full-time.

She became a volunteer in middle school helping out at a convalescent home, and a Candy Striper in high school volunteering at a local hospital.

While Denise has volunteered for many other organizations since arriving in the desert almost 30 years ago, she says that nothing has brought home the need for nutritional support more than what this organization provides for its clients.
